



# 2021 QUEENSBERRY SINGLE VINEYARD PINOT NOIR REVIEWS

## 94 POINTS

Fragrant, floral aroma with the scent of red rose leads to a more fruit-forward palate with dark cherry/berry characters with subtle fresh herb flavours. A backbone of fine, ripe tannins gives energy and suggests cellaring potential.

An enticing mineral laden boquet with scents of chalky clay soils then a core of light red fruits and barrel spices then a soft smoky soil quality. Undeniably complex with a pinosity and charm. Equally enticing on the palate with texture then flavour, an abundance of fine tannins from needle point to moderate then acidity and fruit flavours delivering a a core of red fruits, medium+ acidity and length developing complex finsih. Great drinking from mid to late 2023 through 2030+.

Certified organic, this deeply coloured, very ageworthy wine was estategrown at Queensberry, in the Cromwell Basin, hand-picked and matured for nearly a year in French oak barriques (27 per cent new). A powerful, sturdy red, it has dense cherry, plum and spice flavours, earthy and savoury notes adding complexity, finely balanced tannins, and a real sense of youthful potential. Best drinking 2024+.
